

Salmon Run Conservation Area Timeline

April 22, 2016	Ribbon Cutting Ceremony
August, 2015	NHDOT - WRTA Phase II-A project commences trail construction from Maher property to Salmon Run Conservation Area.
June 30, 2015	Site re-development of former Ernie's property completed. Parking lot and residual seeding to be completed in the fall when trail is completed.
Fall 2014	Town awarded additional Brownsfield grant from Capital Regional Development Council to complete additional cleanup work.
Summer 2014	Enpro Environmental completes site work and removal of hazardous soil; Belknap Landscaping awarded landscaping contract. Town awarded NHDES Petroleum grant.
Spring 2014	Conservation Commission completes site redevelopment design.
Fall 2013	Ernie's Building Demolished.
Spring 2013	Public Hearing on EPA Brownfields Cleanup Alternatives (ABCA) report for Ernie's Cleanup
August 2012	Town awarded EPA cleanup grant and hires Credere Associates as the Environmental Engineering Project Manager.
2011	Level 1, Level 2 and Supplemental Site Assessments completed through Lakes Region Planning Commission Brownfields grant
January 31, 2011	Conservation Commission purchases former Ernie's site and signs Memorandum of Agreement with WRTA allowing easements for trail and defining WRTA maintenance responsibilities.
March 31, 2009	Conservation Commission purchases the lot The "old mill lot" abutting Ernie's.
